Potential new demand for post-school education opportunities

The below four tables identify potential new demand for participation in post-school education for those aged 17 to 20 years from four local government areas (Brighton, Clarence, Glenorchy and Hobart) surrounding the proposed new University of Tasmania STEM facility in the Hobart CBD.

The majority of 17 year olds were participating in secondary schooling (49.4 per cent) or technical or further education (22 per cent). 14 per cent were not participating in education at all. The proportion not participating in any form of education (not applicable) increases with age so that for 20 year olds, 46.5 per cent were not participating in education. The proportion participating in vocational education decreased with age and the proportion participating in university education increased with age.

Table 2 shows the labour force status for those not participating in education by age. While the majority for each age were employed in some form; either full time, part time or away from work, a large proportion were also either unemployed and looking for work (17.9 per cent for 17 year olds, 15 per cent of 18 year olds, 12.9 per cent of 19 year olds and 11.5 per cent of 20 year olds) or not in the labour force at all (31.7 per cent for 17 year olds, 18.6 per cent of 18 year olds, 16.9 per cent of 19 year olds and 17.9 per cent of 20 year olds). *This cohort represents potential new demand for participation in post school education and training which will contribute to improved lifetime opportunity*.

Tables 3 and 4 break down the participation in education by type and the labour force status for those not participating education for each local government area surrounding the University of Tasmania. For each age, the proportion not participating in education at all increases as the distance from the University of Tasmania increases. For each age, the greatest proportion not participating in education is from the Brighton municipality, followed by Glenorchy and then Clarence. The opposite is true for those attending University or other tertiary institutions with Hobart having the highest proportion for each age followed by Clarence, Glenorchy and Brighton. Similar proportions participate in vocational education from Clarence, Brighton and Glenorchy.

For those not participating in education while a large proportion is employed, this varies by local government area. Hobart has the highest proportion of employed for each age, followed by Clarence, Glenorchy and Brighton (excepting for 17 year olds where Clarence has as higher proportion employed than Hobart). For each age, the proportion not participating in education or the labour force at all increases as the distance from the University of Tasmania increases. For each age, the greatest proportion not participating in education nor the labour force is from the Brighton municipality, followed by Glenorchy and then Clarence. In Brighton 43.3 per cent of 17 to 20 year olds are not participating in education and are either unemployed and looking for work or not in the labour force at all. For Glenorchy it is 36.1 per cent, for Clarence it is 29.6 per cent and for Hobart, 24.0 per cent.
